
PAUL'S SECOND MISSIONARY JOURNEY BEGAN GOD IS ALWAYS WORKING.



ACTS 15 MAP

If you've seen a map of the earth, you know it's huge. Remember when **JESUS** told the apostles to be **HIS WITNESSES** in Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, and to the ends of the earth (Acts 1:8)? He wasn't kidding! While in Jerusalem, **BARNABAS** heard that *lots* of Gentiles in Antioch were believing in Jesus. He traveled there, saw it was true, and **CONVINCED PAUL** to join him! A year of sharing the gospel in Antioch prepared Paul and Barnabas for future journeys.

This map shows the different places **GOD SENT** Paul and Barnabas. **BARNABAS** traveled back to his home country of **CYPRUS**, a small island in the Mediterranean Sea, loved today for its beauty and good weather. Born a Jew, **PAUL** journeyed **THROUGHOUT ISRAEL**, going to Syria and

Cilicia to reach the people he knew and understood. Look at the map. Did Paul and Barnabas obey Jesus' command?



SPOTLIGHT ON SILAS

- + Silas is a nickname for Silvanus. Paul used his longer name in 2 Corinthians and in both letters to the Thessalonians.
- + Leader in the early Jerusalem church.
- + Traveled with Peter to Pontius and Cappadocia.
- Served as Peter's scribe for his first letter. In this letter, Silas called himself Silvanus.
- + Traveled with Paul to Asia Minor and Macedonia.
- + Put in the Philippian prison with Paul.
- + When the prison doors opened and they didn't try to escape, Silas and Paul shared the gospel with the jailer and he and his entire household believed!

Born a slave in Virginia in 1752.



LOTTIE MOON


 Served 39 years in China teaching at a girls' school and sharing Christ with women.
